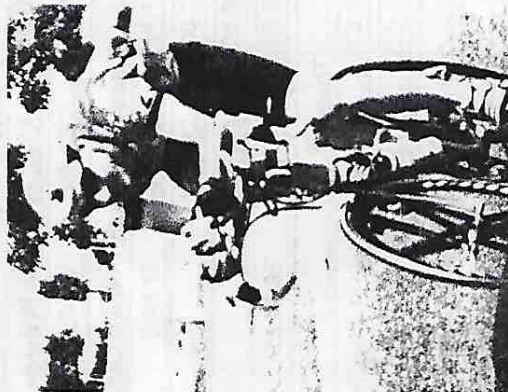

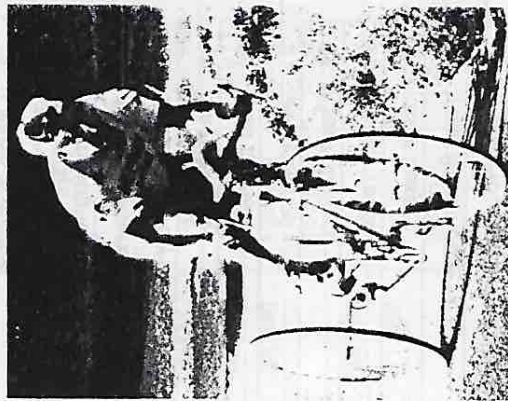

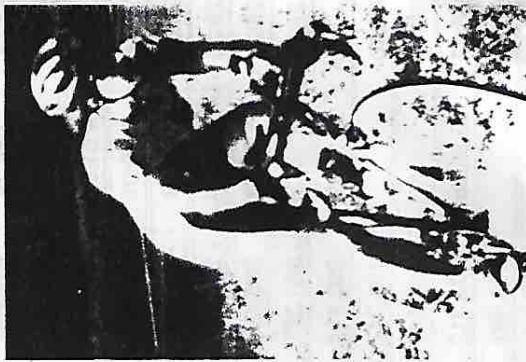

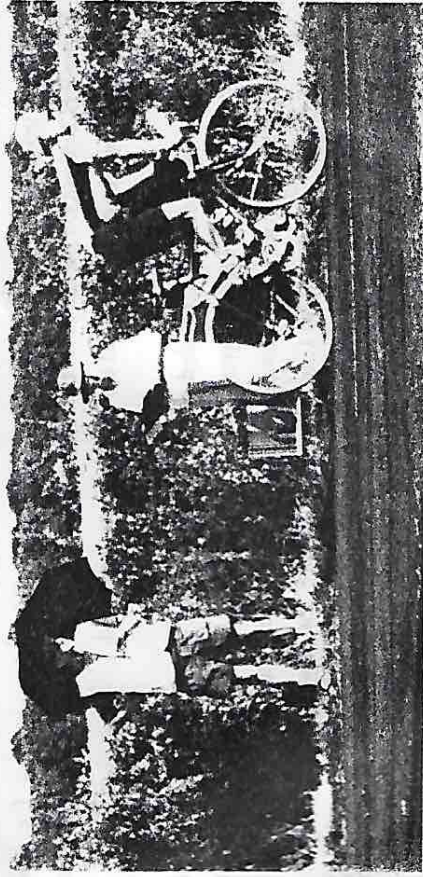

Last August Ernie Hall and John Clapp had been here but John died earlier in the year, however, Ernie made the journey from Crawley and spent a happy weekend with old friends. Tony Farmer, Vic Williams, Ron & Brenda Ash, John Duckworth, Pat Hill and Maurice made up the complement on the Marsh, whilst the Thanet R.C. contingent of Gordon & Alice Haller and Simon Morse were on duty from Cloverleaf

to Park Farm. 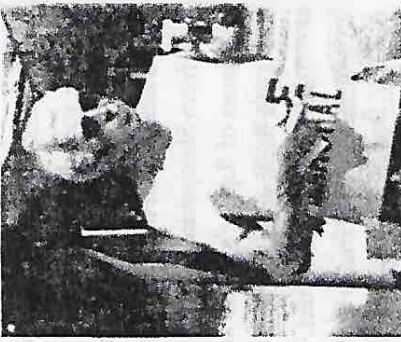


Laurie and Rosemary Broad at the infamous Coleham Green T junction
