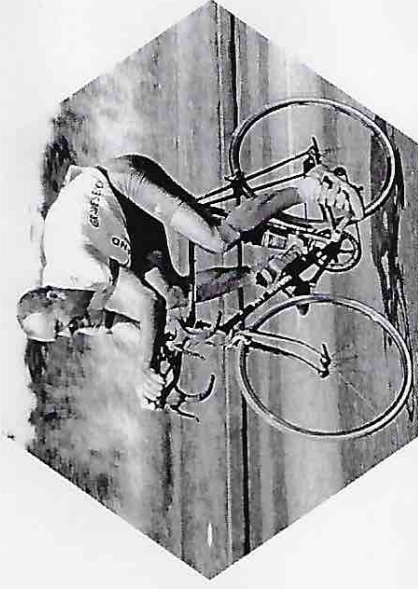

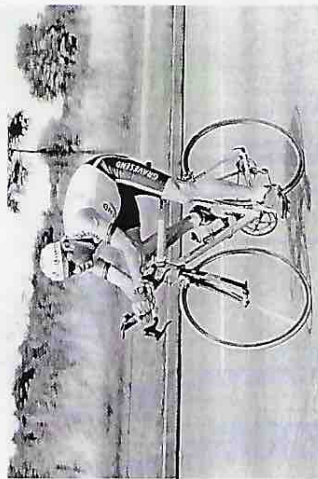
CONGRATULATIONS

Congratulations to this year's winner of the K.C.A. '12', Bob Crayford, and to his Gravesend C.C. clubmates, David Rhodes and Len Brown, who backed him up to clinch victory over their nearest challengers, Southborough Wheelers, by twenty three miles. Bob won the event previously in 1967 (with a mileage of 247.775) and was the Kent C.A. B.A.R. Champion for that year.

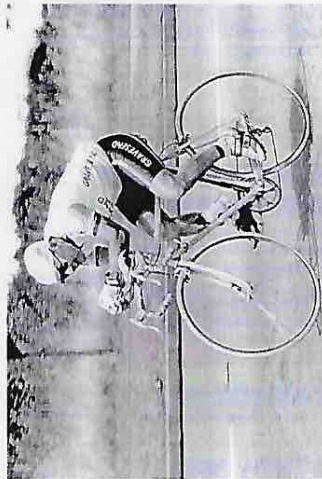
Another person who deserves a special mention is John Booty, also a former winner. He completed 247.51 miles to win the event in 1972, and although his distance this time was less, it's truly remarkable that a 64 year old man can return to competitive cycling and in his first year after a lengthy lay-off, complete all distances so well.

The composition of the Southborough Wheelers team was unusual. Les Hayman is a rider with many years experience of long distance riding. Neil Quarmby had only a 10 mile time on his entry form but subsequently rode the '100' whilst Phil Riley had confined himself to road racing until August 4th.
