The really bad news only hit on Saturday morning when Tim phoned to tell me that traffic lights had been erected in the acceleration lane at Sugarloaf crossroads. Peter Stone went down and investigated and decided that the whirligig around the Ashford/Hamstreet, A2070 and Park Farm roundabouts would be cut from 17 miles to about 4 miles! By the time I got the news there was no time to contact all the marshals to ask them to get out half an hour earlier and, I learnt later, some hadn't had their start sheets delivered anyway, with dire consequences for the riders.

After Ted Hill left the signing-on table to go home to Pat and the dogs and the last man had departed from the hall on Sunday, number neatly pinned on the bottom of his jersey, I stood in the car park and wondered whether to go and watch the kaleidoscopic interchange of riders at the roundabouts – five roundabouts in four miles and fifty three riders to negotiate them? Or should I go to Brenzett with the "unsupported riders" food & drink? I decided to go to Brenzett, see the marshals and pick up the signs on the way. Carmen Kubisa had offered to do the end of Kiln Lane but I was too late for her,

so on to Gordon Davis at Matalan. John Smith & Bob Giles were at New Street Farm and I left the course at the end of Magpie Lane and made my way to the by-pass catching up the first of the competitors on their way to the roundabout. No marshal but as I laid the boxes and bags out on the lawn in front of the garage I saw them all obediently follow the arrows directing them to East Guldeford.

Gary Booth was a little bit late there but no-one went off course, the arrows continued to work. At Lydd junction Gordon Sherwood was also slightly late, but again no-one went off course. At Hammonds Corner Roger Burchett had turned up early and caught the first rider. The self help feeding station at Brenzett seemed to be successful. Thank goodness. This was the only 'feed' this year as CC Bexley had bowed out after more than forty years of early morning duty on the Marsh. I missed seeing their cheerful groups in the lay-bys they chose each year but was thankful for Ann & Brian Heasman's presence up at Kingsnorth as Ann had meticulously recorded every movement up on that quirky circuit – and there were some very odd movements indeed. Other marshals at the roundabouts were Malcolm Strickland, Ernie Mackey, Ann Burden, Maurice & James Carpenter and Dick Bradley. The cavalry arrived in the form of Clin Maisey and Nobby & Beryl Holdstock and they quickly went into marshalling mode when they realised the situation.

Esther's Report

The field for this year's 12 Hour had an international flavour. Australian Stuart Birnie (read his blog - I recommend it.); Ireland's Shay Giles; New Zealander by marriage, Andrew Nye; Carol Bridge representing Wales and from Finland, an unexpectedly jolly Yari Lyden as well as strangers from far flung clubs such as Westerley RC and Kingston Phoenix added an exotic atmosphere to the event.

However it was home grown Andy Miles who showed a clean pair of wheels to his rivals as he tore round the course. Andy didn't have the best of starts as his seat post broke four minutes before he was due to meet the timekeeper and a hurried (and noisy) dash back to the car park was necessary to change his bike. In second place was a newcomer to our event in the person of Tom Glandfield (Lewes Wanderers). Tom joined team-mates Peter Baker and Alan Lloyd and the three, in spite of a good mileage from Peter, failed to win the team prize which went indisputably to VC Elan with third placed Shay Giles and

Alan Lloyd was unlucky to go off course on the Ivychurch circuit and together with two others similarly affected (one of whom was the aforementioned Stuart Birnie who still managed to finish in sixth place with an 'evens' ride), ended up in New Romney, losing several miles. Alan generously said on the Time Trial Forum that when he returned to the place where he went wrong "there were more arrows there than were at Custer's last stand"! It was a good day for the Elan as Shay won the vets prize, a massive 20 miles ahead of Andy Miles who took second and John Clarey, Tour de France finisher in the sixties, was third. Carol Bridge took the lady's prize back to Wales; ten ladies entered and nine started, one having been knocked off her bike the previous Sunday, and nine finished. Mark Amon had the best improvement with Peter Moon and Andy Miles close behind. Peter Holland was first trike. Although the windswept reaches of Romney Marsh were at their worst there were some excellent rides on the day, several p.bs and some near misses and the course appears to have good potential.

Usually after the '12' I feel fairly satisfied that the event has gone off well and vow to get it perfect next time. Perfection certainly didn't occur this year and there were too many conspiracies against us to expect it, all I could hope was that we'd get a satisfactory result at the end of the day and nothing too drastic would go wrong – in spite of roadworks, Royal Mail and its vagaries and an awful weather forecast.
